

Dinghies are used to access the Mid-River or Upstream Swinging Moorings moorings from the end of the Causeway. Please be aware that these are stored at your own risk, we cannot take responsibility for them.

- The dinghy pontoon is located at the end of the Causeway. Spaces are available on a first come first serve basis and are not reserved.
- Dinghy storage for one rigid or one inflatable dinghy is included as part of the mooring package for customers on either the Mid-River or Upstream Swinging Moorings.
- There are 4 WicorMarine owned dinghies that are available for owners to borrow. These are kept on the West Link and the oars are available from the West Link. However, we would recommend that all customers have access to their own dinghy as we cannot guarantee the availability of the WicorMarine dinghies.
- Customers on Walk-Ashore pontoons may be able to book an unallocated dinghy slot on the dinghy pontoon for a fee of £10 / Week. These are subject to availability and the Marina Office will be able to advise if we are able to take any new bookings.
- If you are planning on buying a new rigid dinghy or inflatable tender, please ensure it will fit in the racks on the dinghy pontoon as not all models do:

Rack Orientation	Maximum Length	Maximum Width
Horizontal	2.8m	0.5m
Upright	3.2m	0.5m

- There are no weight restrictions for dinghies, we just ask that you ensure that you can handle it yourself and are able to pull it out of the water, along with being able to manoeuvre it onto the dinghy pontoon and into the racks.
- As per our Regulations, dinghies must be marked clearly with the boat name and this must be visible when the dinghy is in storage. In the event of a shortage of space, we shall remove any unmarked dinghies and dispose of them.
- We strongly recommend that owners lock their dinghies in the racks when not in use. We would recommend a good quality padlock and chains that are protected against being cut. Please check with your insurance company if they have any requirements for locking your dinghy whilst it is on the dinghy pontoon.
- Please ensure that when your dinghy is on the dinghy pontoon, it is within the racks and not blocking the walkways or entrance. No dinghies can be stored laid down on the decking.
- There are cleats on the West Link for Mid-River and Upstream mooring customers to secure their dinghies to whilst unloading and loading.
- No dinghies are permitted to be left unattended whilst tied up at the launching point as this space is in constant use for all customers to launch dinghies.
- Please do not leave dinghies unattended in empty berths on either the Walk-ashore or Mid-River Pontoon Berths as it causes a major inconvenience for berth-holders when they return to their moorings. Instead, please use a fender and tie your tender up alongside your vessel.
